WHAT IS THE JANUARY CHALLENGE?

The idea is simple. For each day in January we set a short creative challenge which only takes 5 to 10 minutes to complete. The challenge might be to write a poem about Mondays, to doodle to music, think your way around a problem or make something taller than you. It is a fun, quick and accessible way to get creative - and getting creative is good for you.

THINK

SHARE

Invite conversation and connection by sharing with others.

TUTOR TIME

- Kick off the day with a quick creative challenge in tutor time.
 Encourage creativity for the sake of it. It's about enjoying the process of doing and having fun, not about the product.
- It's quick and easy you don't need extra materials or resources, everything you'll need you'll already have in your classroom (imaginations included).
- Get involved. The January Challenge is for everybody teachers, staff and students. See what happens when you create together.

STAFF MEETINGS

- Walk the talk use inspirational creative challenges to release minds and get the most from meetings. Whether it's a weekly staff meeting, department catch up or SLT planning session, creative moments are a proven way to improve flow and productivity.
- Reduce the fear of failure and maximise creative thinking by establishing a more playful staff culture. Support staff wellbeing by pausing to catch your breath.
- Creative challenges for staff help to develop a culture of Growth Mindset learning. Teachers' own experiences can spark ideas for building learning resilience in students.

What is your word for 2019? Create word art, calligraphy, or even take a photo that captures that word.

You could be writing a letter to your future self, telling an 'ABC story', doodling the person opposite you...without looking at the page!


Make art out of the content of your drawers. Draw with your 'stuff'!
